An Ordinance concerning

PARKING PERMITS

FOR the purpose of amending certain regulations relating to the issuance of parking permits in the Town of Riverdale Park; establishing a biannual registration and fee for such permits; authorizing the Town Council to limit the number of permits issued for each residence in certain districts; providing for the administration of the Town's parking permit program by the Town Administrator; providing for the expiration of existing parking permits and the transition to biannual registration and permit fees; clarifying an error in the Town Code regarding the amount of a fine for violation of certain parking regulations, including those dealing with parking permit areas; and generally relating to managing on-street parking in certain areas of the Town.

Chapter 64 – Vehicles and Traffic
Sections 64-13(b) and 64-17(a)
Code of the Town of Riverdale Park
(January 2008 Revision)

SECTION 1: BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF RIVERDALE PARK, That Sections 64-13(b) and 64-17(a) of the Code of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision), Chapter 64, Vehicles and Traffic, is repealed and reenacted, with amendments to read as follows:

CHAPTER 64 – VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC**§ 64-13 Parking permit areas.****(b) Permits.**

(1) Permanent resident permits. These permits can be obtained at the Town Office for a fee of ~~two~~ TWENTY-FIVE dollars (~~\$2.00~~ \$25) per permit upon presentation of vehicle registration AND PROOF OF RESIDENCY IN THE PARKING PERMIT AREA. Permanent residential RESIDENT permits are VALID FOR TWO YEARS AND ARE nontransferable. A PERMANENT RESIDENT PERMIT MAY BE RENEWED FOR SUCCESSIVE TWO-YEAR PERIODS. THE TOWN COUNCIL, BY RESOLUTION, MAY LIMIT THE NUMBER OF PERMANENT RESIDENT PERMITS ISSUED FOR EACH RESIDENCE IN A PERMIT AREA. Permit stickers must be attached to the back of the inside rearview mirror.

(2) Guest permits. Residents can obtain up to two (2) permits for use by their guests. Guest permits are designated to a certain residence and must be turned in to the Town Office if the resident moves. There is no fee for guest permits.

(3) Temporary permits. Permits for other than residents and their guests will be granted only on a case-by-case basis by the Town Administrator, subject to review by the Mayor and Council. Such permits will be considered on a temporary basis only, and a time period will be defined. There is no fee for temporary permits.

(4) THE TOWN ADMINISTOR SHALL ADMINISTER THE PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM AND MAY PROMULGATE REASONABLE PROCEDURES AND FORMS FOR THIS PURPOSE.

§ 64-17 Violations and penalties.

(a) Violations of §§ 64-4 through 64-10(k) (except § 64-7) and §§ 64-10(n) through 64-13 are declared to be municipal infractions, for which the penalty for each violation shall be ~~twenty-five~~ FIFTY dollars (\$50).


SECTION 2: AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the biannual registration and permit fees provided for by Section 1 of this Ordinance are intended to supplant all existing parking permits issued by the Town. All existing

permits are void as of June 30, 2012. The Town Administrator shall establish and implement a transition process for the holders of all existing permits to register, pay permit fees and obtain new permits under the Ordinance.

SECTION 3: AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after its passage by the Council.
