NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF  
CHARTER AMENDMENT RESOLUTION NO. 2015-CR-01  
TOWN COUNCIL MINIMUM AGE REQUIREMENT**

This is to give notice that on January 4, 2016, the Riverdale Park Town Council adopted on Charter Amendment Resolution No. 2015-CR-01 (“the Resolution”). The title of the Resolution is as follows:

A RESOLUTION concerning

CHARTER AMENDMENT – MINIMUM AGE OF COUNCIL MEMBER

FOR the purpose amending the Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park to alter the minimum age for a person to serve as a member of the Riverdale Park Town Council; and generally relating to qualifications to serve on the Town Council.

**BY** repealing and reenacting, with amendments  
Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park (January 2008 Revision)  
ARTICLE II, The Town Council  
Section 202

Charter Amendment Resolution No. 2015-CR-01 would amend Section 202 of the Charter of the Town of Riverdale Park to alter the minimum age for a person to serve as a member of the Riverdale Park Town Council; and generally relate to qualifications to serve on the Town Council.

Charter Amendment Resolution No. 2015-CR-01 is available for inspection by the public at Town Hall during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The amendment to the Charter will become effective on February 23, 2016, subject to the provisions of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland regarding the right of the qualified voters of the Town to petition the proposed amendment to referendum.

## **Ward and Committee Reports**

### **Ward Two Report**

This time of year is always a bit annoying to me – winter is dragging on, and spring is far away. I’m thankful this time of

year that we have the winter farmer’s market, and, frankly, coffee.

#### **Dog Park (including parking)**

As I mentioned in my December/January report, I’m moving forward on establishing some dedicated parking spaces for dog park patrons on the

east side of 51<sup>st</sup> Avenue. I've seldom seen a car parked in these "Riverdale-Park-resident-only" spaces, so I don't think it will be a big deal to convert them. After speaking with Mayor Archer and other members of the council, the best idea right now seems to be simply removing the parking restrictions on the northern end of 51<sup>st</sup> just enough to create three standard parallel parking spaces (there will be two accessible spaces as they already are planned in the existing park design). If we find that the spaces are being used inappropriately or need more restrictions, we'll add that in the future.

### **Bridge to Whole Foods / Riverdale Park Station**

As anticipated in last month's article, the CSX bridge project is moving forward. The Rivertech Court cut through was closed on December 14, as almost everyone seems to know (I still occasionally see a car drive up, sit dejectedly for a little while at the "road closed" sign, and then turn right on Tuckerman); utility work is going on right now. The whole project is projected to take eighteen months to complete, so mark your calendars for the bridge opening in May of 2017! (And expect to see a lot of changes up there as construction really gets going).

### **Major Revisions to the Structure of Town Government**

In my Ward Report at the January 4 Town Council meeting I opened discussion about a major change to the structure of Town Government. In this report I will discuss what I'm thinking about and why. There will be a lot more news about this in the next few months.

Maryland has two primary structures for municipal government. The first is the "strong mayor" structure, where the mayor

is intimately involved with the day-to-day operations of town government (and usually has the power to veto legislation enacted by the council). Of nearby towns, University Park has a government that is closest to this form of government. The second is the "council manager" structure, where a council sets policies through budgets and resolutions, and a professional (non-elected) town manager implements the policies. Of nearby municipalities, Greenbelt is probably the one closest to this form of government (their mayor is simply the council member who received the largest number of votes).

It is unusual for a municipality in Maryland to have a pure version of either of these two structures – most towns and cities have a structure that mixes the two forms, as Riverdale Park does (Mayor Archer is involved with day-to-day operations, but Town Administrator Imhulse performs many of the tasks that a "strong mayor" would, such as reviewing contracts and signing checks. Our mayor also cannot veto legislation passed by the Council.).

Our plan with this legislation is to move Riverdale Park to a form of government that is closer to the "council manager" form of government, similar to that our neighbors College Park and Hyattsville have. I anticipate proposing that we will still have an elected Mayor, but almost all day-to-day operations will be handled by a Town Manager. The reason for this is that the current duties of the Mayor are extremely demanding of time and energy, and these duties will only increase when the Cafritz/Riverdale Park Station project is completed and Riverdale Park becomes a larger municipality. Mayor Archer and I have been discussing this change for several weeks and are in agreement that it is a

good idea, though we must pay a lot of attention to details.

I anticipate having more concrete information in next month's Town Crier, but welcome your input on this major change we are considering for our Town government.

### **Snow**

Snow season is upon us, and I just want to remind everyone in Ward 2 that during a snow emergency (which is probably happening any time snow plows are on the streets) you should park *only* on the even side of the street. For streets that run east-west (mostly those that are not numbered, such as "Riverdale Road") parking is allowed only on the north side of the street, if there aren't numbers to guide you. For streets that run north-south (many of which, in Ward 2, don't have houses on them) parking is allowed only on the west side of the street. Observing these rules will allow our streets to be cleared efficiently by our devoted Public Works department.

### **Farmers' Market**

The Farmers' Market is open all winter! It is open every Thursday from 3pm to 7pm at 6202 Rhode Island Avenue (at the corner of Rhode Island and Riverdale Road). Produce at the market this time of year includes potatoes, cabbage, turnips, beets, apples, pumpkins, greens, peppers, gourds, cider, mums, baked goods, honey, pastured meats, eggs from free range hens, and fresh small batch roasted coffees. I hope to see you at the market!

## **Public Works Report**

**Saturday Drop Off** – Scheduled dates in 2016 for drop off of bulk trash on the third Saturday of each month, from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m., are: **February 20**, March 19, April 16, May 21, June 18, July 16, August 20, September 17, October 15, November 19, December 17.

**Holiday Trash Collection** – Regular trash **will** be collected on Monday, February 15<sup>th</sup> because of President's day, but will resume on Thursday, February 18<sup>th</sup>.

### **Office Closings** –

- Town offices will be closed Monday, February 15<sup>th</sup> for President's Day.

➡ **Recycling Disposal** - The Waste Management Division of the Prince George's County Department of Environmental Resources issued a notice to resident's last year that requires **ALL recycling** to be placed in the **blue toters** that they issue to residents or in **collection cans/containers (i.e., trash cans), clearly marked "RECYCLING" or with an "X."** **NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY KIND ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINER** (i.e., plastic grocery bags, plastic wrappers on soda or water containers). Plastic can be included in and picked up on regular trash collection days. For additional information, please call 311 or 301-883-5810.

### **WSSC Schedule of Service Connections** –

From February through April 2016, the WSSC will perform numerous service connection projects in our community. Please see attached schedule for details.

The same list is available on the Town's website ([www.riverdaleparkmd.gov](http://www.riverdaleparkmd.gov)) or you can visit our Town Hall to pick up a copy.

**Guide to Public Works** – An updated Guide to Public Works is now available for distribution. It is included as part of a packet of public works services and Town resources that all residents will find helpful as they seek information on how to acquire services in/outside of our community. New residents will find the packets useful for services such as trash/toters, recycling, bulk trash pickup and drop off, yard waste, names of their council members and mayor, and more. In addition, residents can sign up to get the same information sent to them via email by calling the Department of Public Works at 301-864-1803.

**Yard Waste Collection - As a reminder,** effective January 1, 2014, the Waste Management Division of the Prince George's County Department of Environmental Resources issued a notice (included in resident's August 2013 tax bill) that requires **ALL yard waste** to be placed in brown paper bags or loose in a **clearly marked "YARD WASTE" collection can/container (i.e., trash cans)**. Yard waste will no longer be collected in plastic bags. For additional information, please call 311 or 301-883-5810.

**Trash Toter Repair/Replacement** – Residents should call the Department of Public Works for the repair or replacement of damaged trash toters, i.e., broken lids, missing wheels, cracked toters, etc. When repairs or replacements are needed, they will occur on Thursday of each week.

**Prince George's County Information** – To expedite requests for services provided by Prince George's County's, residents should utilize their information number, **which is 311**. Using that number will enable residents to address county related concerns such as questions, complaints, animal control requests, or other service needs for which the county is responsible.

**Snow Emergency Conditions** – Snow emergency conditions shall be considered in effect within the Town of Riverdale Park whenever the Prince George's County Executive, the Maryland State Highway Administration or the Maryland State Police declares a snow emergency in effect in Prince George's County.

**Laws that apply:**

- During any period in which a snow emergency condition exists and a snow emergency is in effect, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any part of any street designated as a snow emergency street, provided that signs have been erected on that street giving notice that such street is a designated snow emergency street.
- During any period in which a snow emergency condition is in effect, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on the odd-numbered side of any public street in the Town of Riverdale Park regardless of whether such street has been designated a snow emergency street. Streets with parking restricted on one side are exempt from this section.
- Any vehicle parked in violation of the snow emergency provisions of the section may be removed and impounded by or under the

direction of any duly authorized police officer. The owner of said vehicle, in addition to any towing or impound fee, shall be liable for a fine of \$250.

**Snow and Ice Removal**—As we enter into the snow season, please note that Public Works crews will be plowing and salting Town streets and parking lots to clear snow and ice. As in the past, we will treat our streets in the following method:

**Primary Streets** - i.e., Riverdale Road, Taylor Road, Lafayette Avenue, Queensbury Road, etc.

**Secondary Streets** – i.e., DuPont Circle, Cleveland Avenue, Rhode Island Avenue, Quesada Road, Beale, 49<sup>th</sup> and 48<sup>th</sup> Avenues, Silk Tree Drive, etc.

**Residential Streets** – i.e., Oliver Street, Madison Street, Rittenhouse Street, 47<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Somerset Road, Sora Lane, etc.

Please note: our major roadways, Rt. 201, Rt. 1, Rt. 410, Good Luck Road, will be treated by the State and County.

Residents of our Town should note that they will be responsible for doing their part by keeping the walkway in front of their property cleaned of snow and ice after each event.



### What Residents Can Do?

- Whenever possible, move parked cars off the street so that snowplows can remove the snow from the street from curb to curb.
- If off-street parking is not available, **park on the even side of the street (violators will be subject to having their vehicles impounded and fined \$250 – 64-10(b)(c)).**
- Be patient during any snow emergency as crews work around the clock to clear the streets.
- Clear sidewalks in front of residence and refrain from depositing snow back on to the roadway (this can potentially cause an accident).
